

Setting the Stage:

- Adolescents need to learn how to access health care in general.
 - ACA makes accessing care easier with broad coverage and more services available with no copay!

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Call to Action:


Frontline staff and service providers should make sure youth have the following:

- Information about their rights to seek care;
 - Information on what contraception and testing are available, and other services offered at clinics; and
 - Resources on where and how to find a youth-friendly clinic.



Essential Health Benefits of ACA2

- Ambulatory patient services;
- Emergency services;
- Hospitalization;
- Maternity and newborn care;
- Mental health and substance use disorder services, including behavioral health treatment;
 - Prescription drugs;
 - Rehabilitative and habilitative services and devices;
 - Laboratory services;
 - Preventive and wellness services and chronic disease management; and
 - Pediatric services, including oral and vision care.

Sexual & Reproductive Services for Adolescents: 45

- Cervical dysplasia screening (sexually active females);
- HIV screening (ages 15-65 and adolescents at higher risk);
- HPV vaccine (check state requirements for parental notification);
- **STI prevention counseling and screening** (adults & adolescents at higher risk);
- Cervical cancer screening (sexually active women);
- **Contraception** (as prescribed, excluding plans offered by exempt "religious employers"); and
- Well-woman visits, including pap smears and pelvic exams.








Not Any Clinic Will Do! Youth-Friendly Services


A Teen-Friendly Reproductive Health Visit




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- · Select programs with activities that link teens (e.g., Reducing the Risk has a clinic visit).
- · Adapt programs to include careseeking activities (e.g., clinic visits or investigating clinics about services).
- · Integrate supplemental lessons/ resources to demonstrate the value of and ease of seeking services (e.g., Keep It Simple).
- · Promote Websites with clinic locators and text reminders (e.g., StayTeen, Bedsider, Teens in NYC, The Playbook).
- · Encourage clinical providers to use patient reminders (e.g., Bedsider Providers).
- · Establish collaboration between clinical providers and school health personnel.
- · Use mobile apps that support clinic use (e.g., GCAPP gPower, Teens in
- · Promote local Websites (e.g., The Playbook, Before Play Colorado).
- Engage youth in creative ways through music, theater, and art.
