## Commemorate Stonewall with LGBTQ-Inclusive Sex Ed!

This month is the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the <u>Stonewall uprising</u>, which was a key turning point in the modern LGBTQ civil rights movement. Although much progress has been made since 1969, <u>less than 5%</u> of middle and high school students across the country reported having positive discussions of LGBT-related topics in their health classes. Compared to their straight and cisgender peers, LGBTQ youth are <u>less likely</u> to use condoms or <u>birth control</u> and are more likely to experience dating violence. LGBTQ-inclusive sex education helps youth get the information they need and deserve to stay safe and healthy.
